Required Text:

Biography/Autobiography of your choice

Student Requirements:

- Read a minimum of 20 minutes a day and complete the attached summer reading log.
- Read a biography or autobiography of your choice.
- Complete the paper bag book report.

Students are expected to read a minimum of 20 minutes each day during the summer. To allow for choice, students will have the opportunity to select a biography or autobiography to read about an individual that inspires them. After reading, they will create a paper bag book report that will serve as a tool for discussion and will be reviewed by the classroom teacher at the beginning of the school year.

Students will return their reading logs and paper bag book reports to their teacher on the first day of school. Students will then be acknowledged for their dedication to reading over the summer.
