Nursing Notes



Our District Lead Nurse, Kerri Gustafson, BSN, RN, NCSN, recently updated the Health Services Website on the District website. It includes wellness information, policies, forms for school and other helpful information.

Auburn Public Schools - Health Services

Winter is here and with it comes all those winter germs. Here are some tips to help prevent the spread of germs:

Take everyday preventive actions to stop the spread of germs.

Take other preventive actions in addition to vaccination that may help reduce the spread of viruses like flu.

- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- If you are sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them. For <u>flu</u>, CDC recommends that people stay home for at least 24 hours after their fever is gone except to get medical care or other necessities. Fever should be gone without the need to use a fever-reducing medicine.

Cover coughs and sneezes.

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Masks also can help reduce the spread of respiratory viruses. People who are sick might be asked to wear a mask to protect others, but a mask can protect the wearer too. This might be especially important if you are at higher risk of developing serious complications from flu.

Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.

- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with viruses that cause flu.
- Virus in the air can spread between people more easily indoors than outdoors. Improving air quality, such as opening windows or using air purifiers, can help reduce the amount of virus you are exposed to.

Here's a snapshot of what to expect in each subject area.

In social studies, our young historians will delve into the rich history of the Wampanoag people. The students will learn about the Wampanoag tribe's culture, traditions, and their significant role in American history. To enhance their understanding, we encourage parents to engage in discussions with their children about what they are learning.

December is all about mastering multiplication facts! The students will be engaged in fun and creative activities to solidify their understanding of multiplication. Practicing at home with games, flashcards, songs, Xtra Math, and real-life scenarios will greatly enhance their mathematical skills. Your support in reinforcing these concepts is truly appreciated.

In reading, we're diving into expository texts about our Earth and its neighbors. Additionally, the third graders will immerse themselves in folktales featuring animals. Encourage your child to share their newfound knowledge and stories with you at home. This is a wonderful opportunity to foster a love for reading and expand their understanding of different genres. Please remind your child to read at least 15 minutes each day at home which has numerous benefits including increasing vocabulary, strengthening comprehension, and improving writing skills.

In writing, our budding authors will be busy crafting fictional stories and free verse poems this month. Encourage creativity and imagination at home by discussing their writing projects. Your encouragement and interest play a vital role in nurturing their writing skills.

In science, we'll be exploring the wonders of water and the fascinating changes in seasonal weather. Discussions will also include important lessons about weather hazards. Engage your child in conversations about these topics to reinforce their scientific knowledge and curiosity.

Mark your calendars for the third grade Winter Concert on Monday, December 11th, where our talented third graders will showcase their musical skills!

Grade 4 News



We hope all of our families had a wonderful and restful Thanksgiving break. As we say goodbye to November, we say hello to a very busy time of year for our students both at home and in school. There will be much excitement this month, and it becomes a bit more challenging for students to maintain focus on learning. Thank you for your support by making sure homework is completed every night.

In math, we will be wrapping up Chapter 4 the content of which was learning strategies for dividing with one digit divisors. It's great to see the students using the different strategies and mental math to divide. Learning to estimate is an important real life strategy that we all use. Many strategies for dividing involve multiplication so students should keep practicing their facts daily.

In science, we have completed our first unit. Students learned about Earth's features and how they are affected by weathering, erosion, deposition, and Earth's natural hazards.

In social studies, we will be finishing our unit on immigration before the holiday break. After this, we will be studying the regions of the United States for the remainder of the year. We will begin our study with the Northeast region.

In Wonders, we will be completing unit 2. The topic for this reading unit is animals. The Big Idea is, "How do animal characters change familiar stories?". We have read some folk tales and plays with animals as the main characters. We also read nonfiction texts as well. The children have really enjoyed these animal selections. It is important that your child continues to read at home so he or she can practice the comprehension and vocabulary skills learned in class. Children are never too old to be read to and enjoy literature with an adult. Not only will you be creating great bonding moments, but it will help your child's fluency and comprehension.

We wish all our families a very Happy Holiday! Thank you for a wonderful 2023. We look forward to working with you in 2024.

December in Grade 5



Homework: In addition to nightly homework assignments, we ask that your child spend at least 20 minutes reading each night. It is also important that students master all math facts.

Curriculum:

In <u>Math</u>, we have just completed Chapter 3, which focused on adding and subtracting decimals. We are currently learning how to multiply decimals in Chapter 4. The focus of Chapter 5 will be dividing decimals. It would benefit your students greatly if they mastered multiplication and division facts. In <u>Science</u>, we have switched to our next science topic/science teacher. If you have any questions about Science, do not hesitate to get in touch with your student's homeroom or science teacher.

In <u>Social Studies</u>, we are finishing up learning about the 13 original colonies and have moved on to the American Revolution. Students are very excited to learn about this time in our history.

In <u>Reading</u>, we are finishing up Unit 2 in our Wonders Program. This unit focused on text features, context clues, theme, sequencing, and setting. We continue to work on answering open-response questions using text evidence to support our answers.

Communication: Please stay in communication with your child's teacher. It is essential that we work together to ensure that each child has a successful year!
